Yes we have an Advisory Committee. There is a Chairman (Professor Debashish Gangopadhyay from the Physics Department), two Computer Science Faculty (Swami Sarvottamananda and Swami Dhyanagamyananda) and Monk in charge of library.

- Library has been made accessible to students, faculty, and staff of the university.
- Students can recommend books and study materials to be added to the library collection. Their recommendations are processed within one working day.

• For Librarian

The Central Library of RKMVU, Belur Campus is a hub of academic and research activities. The library has a latest collection of books to aid our curriculum, reference books, journals, educational CDs and DVDs for the use of students, staff and other borrowers. Our library acquired some rare and important collections of paper manuscripts. These are yet to be catalogued. The newly added resources to library (books, journals) are displayed for the convenience of students, and faculty members. Search for any book can be made through KOHA library management software. This library is a member of

INFLIBNET Consortium assisting us in providing online electronic resources to our users and extending reference and referral services to the users. Internet browsing facilities are also available through LAN, but only educational sites are allowed for surfing.

At the beginning of academic session, department of library organizes an orientation programme to help the newly admitted students of the various post-graduate departments know about the facilities offered by library. Currently the library members can avail the reprography and scanning facility through a centralised Xerox & Scanning machine. This facility will soon be made dedicated for the purpose of library processes.

8. Provide details of the annual library budget and the amount spent for purchasing new books and journals.

For the year 2015-16 an informal budgetary allocation of Rs 3.5 lakhs was provided from university funds for acquisition of books and print journals. Of this amount library has spent Rupees 3 lakhs.

Note that this investment excludes acquisitions obtained through sanctioned projects.

9. What initiatives has the university taken to make the library a 'happening place' on campus?

To make the 'happening place' university library has taken the following initiatives:

- 1. Collection of Audio-visual e-resources for language learning is in process.
- 2. Collection of Educational CD/DVDs for learning specific subject (offered by the university) is in process.

10. What are the strategies used by the library to collect feedback from its users? How is the feedback analysed and used for the improvement of the library services?

• Powered by Moodle we have an online feedback system in place, setup this year (2016), for collecting feedbacks from students. The students are urged to duly complete the filling of feedback form at the end of the academic year. We are yet to receive their feedback.

11. List the efforts made towards the infrastructural development of the library in the last four years.

- A new library building was inaugurated in November 2015 with minimal office support.
- Wi-Fi facility has been installed in 2016.
- The entire catalogue of 21327 books was barcoded in a record period of under four months during 2015-16.
- In 2015 we renovated the stack area providing 40 additional 5 shelf-racks to accommodate future expansion.
- Interior decoration, acquiring 1300 metal book stoppers, and 4 portable racks goes into infrastructural developments during the year 2015-16.
- Setting up of 6 dedicated internet access enabled computers for the purpose of opac search.
