## **<u>1. Historic Backdrop: Swami Vivekananda's Vision and Objectives:</u>**



Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University, formerly known as 'Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute' is a humble first step in actualizing Swami Vivekananda's vision of a University at Belur Math, the headquarters of Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission that he founded at the behest of his Master, Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa. In fact, on 2 July 1902, just a couple of days before he passed away, Swami Vivekananda prophesied that "the spiritual impact that has come to Belur [Math] will last fifteen hundred years; and it will be a great university. Do not think I imagine it; I *see* it." On another occasion, he wrote: "Now, the aim is to gradually develop this [Belur] Math into an all round university." As a humble step in actualizing this vision, Ramakrishna Mission started a University in 2005 under the name 'Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute'. It is also known as 'Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University', as subsequently renamed. In its effort to actualize Swami

Vivekananda's vision of imparting 'man-making' and character-building education, the University has set its objectives as achieving excellence in the field of higher education on the one hand and on the other to create a band of educated youth who would, in Swami Vivekananda's words, possess 'muscles of iron and nerves of steel and a mind made of the same material of which the thunderbolt is made'—in short the objective is the creation of 'complete human beings' with 'head, hand and heart' fully developed: 'heart to feel, brains to conceive, and hands to work', men and women of impeccable character, inflexible moral fibre, penetrating intellects, lion-like courage and above all, intense feeling for the underprivileged and the downtrodden masses of India, those who would passionately feel and work for rebuilding a glorious India of the future—powerful, vigorous and rejuvenated.

## 2. Objectives, Uniqueness and Salient Features—the 'thrust areas':

The uniqueness of the University consists in its following salient features: (i) the emphasis on certain 'thrust areas' which are also 'gap areas' in that these areas scarcely receive any attention in the conventional universities in India, (ii) the multi-campus character of the University—it operates through a wide network of specialized Faculty Centres in these thrust areas located in different parts of India at the various branch-centres of Ramakrishna Mission some of which have been working in these areas for decades, (iii) the inculcation of higher human values in our attempt to realize Swami Vivekananda's vision of education as 'life-building, man-making character-making assimilation of ideas'—value-based education forms the essential component of *all* the courses run by the University.

#### To start with, the following 'thrust areas' have been chosen:

- (1) Disability Management and Special Education
- (2) Integrated Rural Development including Tribal Development
- (3) Indian Cultural and Spiritual Heritage and Value Education
- (4) Fundamental sciences—integrated teaching and research
- (5) Environmental Science and Disaster Management including relief and rehabilitation

#### 2.A. Special Features of Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education (FDMSE) Coimbatore Campus, Tamil Nadu:

The Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education (FDMSE) is located in the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, a major education center of the Ramakrishna Mission.

FDMSE is playing an active role in the field of disability management for last three decades. It offers comprehensive services to persons with various disabilities. It caters to the educational and vocational training needs pertaining to persons with disabilities. The Faculty offers training not only to the personnel seeking knowledge in training of persons with disabilities but also to the persons with disabilities who seek training in areas such as Computers, Braille, Abacus, Orientation & Mobility, Sign Language.

#### IHRDC - Vidyalaya Unit for the Persons with Disabilities and its up gradation to FDMSE

The International Human Resource Development Centre for the Disabled (IHRDC) was established in 1984 with the primary objective of producing Braille books for blind children and later on upgraded to an independent international institute of full-fledged human resource development in disability management in the year 2001. The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, as per its notification dated 5 January 2005, based on the recommendation of the University Grants Commission (UGC), accorded a University – status to our International Human Resource Development Center for the Disabled (IHRDC) in the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, naming it as the Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute (RKMVERI). Later the name of the institute was coined as Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University (RKMVU), having its Headquarters at Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math, West Bengal with its Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education (FDMSE) in the Vidyalaya, Coimbatore after receiving official communication from University Grants Commission.

#### Vision of FDMSE:

The aim of FDMSE is to translate the vision of Swami Vivekananda into action. The vision of FDMSE is based on the fact that the strength of persons, of even those with disabilities, can be aroused for constructive purposes by professionally trained teachers. The Faculty believes that by strengthening the hearing ability of visually impaired person, visual ability of hearing impaired person, motor ability of mentally retarded persons and cognitive ability of persons with locomotor disability through well trained professionals, seemingly impossible results may be achieved. The human resource development of a country is directly linked to the level of education of its citizens. Special efforts are to be taken to bring the disabled populations under the umbrella of education to tap their potential and make them contributing members to the society. Without providing education for the disabled children we cannot claim to have provided education to all. In order to train teachers to take up this important work of educating children with special needs, FDMSE is offering courses in Special Education.

#### **Mission of FDMSE:**

- Offering training programme at all levels for preparing personnel and professionals for special education and rehabilitation programmes, catering to the needs of persons with visual impairment, hearing impairment and mental retardation.
- Organizing short term training programs for preparing multi-purpose rehabilitation workers to serve persons with disabilities.
- Organizing awareness programmes for parents, administrators and public for facilitating effective implementation of service programmes for persons with disabilities.
- Promoting context based models leading to educating all children with disabilities.

- Preparing literature such as handouts and brochures on education and rehabilitation of persons with disabilities.
- Organizing orientation programmes for general classroom teachers for implementing inclusive education programme for the disabled children.
- Promoting research in specific educational and rehabilitation areas, whose results would strengthen development of inclusive schooling and community based rehabilitation programmes.
- Offering continuing education programmes for the personnel working in the field of education and rehabilitation of the disabled.
- Providing guidance & counselling services for persons with special needs to promote education & employment opportunities.

## **2.B.** Special Features of General Adapted Physical Education and Yoga (GAPEY), Coimbatore Campus, Tamil Nadu:

Aims and objective of the Faculty are-

- 1. Preparing world class teachers in Physical education for General population and Disabled Population.
- 2. Train persons to become trainer for Special Olympics and Paralympics.
- 3. Carry out research in the broad area of Physical Education.
- 4. Disseminate knowledge through peer review publications and study manuals.
- 5. Train people with disabilities to take part in recreational sports and to perform in competitive sporting events.

6. Integrate Yogic practices as a part of life through various courses and training sessions.

## **2.C.** Special Features of the Faculty of Computer Science Applications and Research (FYCSAR), Coimbatore Campus, Tamil Nadu:

Work Integrated Learning Program, M.Sc (Computer Science Application): A progressing Industry based society demands that its employees must constantly be acquainted with newer skills, recent trends and cutting edge technologies throughout their tenure. To meet such demands students must constantly be updating their academics and be engaged in self-development activities. Therefore, keeping in view the industry's needs, an Integrated M.Sc. programme has been designed wherein the Diploma students of Computer Engineering, working in software related companies and institutions at different places of Coimbatore can pursue the course while still at work. Syllabuses are framed according to the suggestions made by the industry and academicians. Theories are taught by our teachers at Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University, Coimbatore Campus during weekends and holidays strictly adhering to UGC norms regarding the credit requirements. Practicals related to theory and training on real time projects are taught and taken care by Team Leaders of the Industry. Upon completion of the course, the students are re-absorbed into the company as employees. This system ensures 100% employability as skilled trainees; bridges the gap between academics & industrial needs and qualifies the students to express their invaluable opinions regarding different contents of the course.

A Post Doctoral Fellowship Project sponsored by Department of Science and Technology under Cognitive Science Research Initiative (CSRI) on "**Executive Functions in preschool-aged Indian children**". **19.2. Training programmes:** Training programmes were conducted for farmers, farm women, rural youths and extension functionaries on different technologies in on campus or off campus mode. **19.3. On-Farm Trials** (**OFT**): OFTs were conducted on farmers' problems in the farmers' field with the participation of farmers in six disciplines, viz., Agronomy, Plant Protection, Horticulture, Seed Production, Fisheries and Animal Sciences in which 114 participants actively participated. Following 12 OFTs were conducted during 2015 - 16 on different farmers' problems as under:

(i) Assessment of effect of different dates of sowing in *Rabi* Sunflower.

(ii) Studies on the Bio-efficacy of Pretilachlor and Oxyflurofen in *boro* transplanted rice and its effect on the soil microflora in medium to low land situation of South 24 Parganas district.

(iii) Assessment of fertilizer dose for increasing yield of onion.

(iv) Assessment of performance of organic and inorganic pesticides for the management of Diamond Back Moth of Cabbage.

(v) Assessment of different hybrid varieties of Sunflower in Rabi season.

(vi) Evaluation of submergence tolerant rice varieties for low land situation of South 24 Parganas district

(vii) Assessment of techniques to reduce leaf curl disease of chilli for higher production and productivity.

(viii) Assessment of IPM techniques to reduce stem borer (S. incertulus) and leaf folder (N. medinalis) infestation for higher production and productivity.

(ix) Studies on the package of management for Scampi (*Macrobrachium rosenbergii*) culture in extensive pond culture system of S-24 Parganas district.

(x) Studies on the performance of integrated fish–duck–dyke vegetables production System

(xi) Evaluation of different mode of disinfectant application on udder health and low milk yield of crossbred cows.

(xii) Assessment of performance of different improved poultry breeds in backyard system in South 24 Parganas district.

**19.4. Frontline demonstration (FLD)**: FLDs were conducted on different technologies based on crop production, plant protection, veterinary and animal sciences and fisheries. Total 36 different FLDs were conducted in 56.62 ha area, 115 units and 1386 farmers participated in these FLD programmes.

## (d) Success stories/Case studies/Special achievements, if any (two or three pages write-up on each case with suitable action photographs):

i) The newly established SasyaShyamala KVK took up poultry development from the very first year in 2014 in different villages. One such village was Moutala of Baruipur block of South 24 Parganas district, West Bengal. Most of the farmers of this village were not doing well in traditional poultry farming practices due to lack of adoption of improved management practices and marketing facilities of the eggs. Local farmers traditionally used to rear '*Deshi*' duck and poultry breeds, and sold surplus eggs to middlemen. Market of egg in the villages was controlled by middlemen who gave very low prices for the eggs. Many farmers abandoned

poultry venture out of frustration. SasyaShyamala KVK of West Bengal started their programmes in the village and promoted improved poultry production using introduction of better poultry breeds and management practices. KVK conducted training and Frontline Demonstrations (FLD) on Poultry Breeds and Artificial Brooders. KVK formed groups with interested poultry growers for scientific rearing of Khaki Campbell Ducks and Vanaraja Chicken breeds and helped the farmers with technological guidance and some critical inputs like improved chick breeds, timely vaccination etc. As a result of KVK's intervention, poultry egg production of both duck and hen increased. An intervention in marketing of eggs was needed as the next step.

Sasya Shyamala KVK tied up with District Administration of South 24 Parganas district and 'Sundarban Co-Operative Milk & Livestock Producers' Union Ltd (SMLU)' for marketing of eggs from village grown ducks and chickens directly to urban customers. As per the understanding, farmers now get Rs.5.50 per egg throughout the year. This price offered by District Administration is more than the price offered by traders and middlemen to the extent of Rs. 1.00 – Rs.0.50. Now on an average, 5000 duck and 2000 poultry eggs are being directly marketed per month in the brand name of 'Sundorini'. The 'Sundorini' brand was inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal Smt. Mamata Banerjee on 9<sup>th</sup> October, 2015. Benefits of marketing linkage for eggs presently cover more than fifty households in the operational area.



## (e) Details of innovative methodology or innovative technology of Transfer of Technology developed and used during the year:

**Integrated Pest Management of Rice:** Sasya Shyamala KVK conducted on farm testing on Integrated Pest Management (IPM) of boro paddy in 5 ha area at Uttar Raipur village, Budge Budge-II, S-24 Pgs during this year as a method of transfer of technology. The technology has been demonstrated in 20 farmers field.

#### Major components:

i) Physiologically mature seed selection followed by Seed Treatment with Carbendazim 12% + Mancozeb 63% WP

- ii) Seedling dip in Carbendazim 12% + Mancozeb 63% WP
- iii) Application of Chlorantraniliprole 0.4% GR @ 4kg/acre at 15-45 DAT
- iv) 2 rows skip transplanting after 10 rows
- v) Installation of Pheromone trap for Stem borer @ 12/ha
- vi) Erection of Bird percher and structure for spider population build up.
- vii) Need based spot application of Fipronil @ 0.5 ml/l

He had a comprehensive plan for community development, both urban and rural, integrating the best elements of the East and the West. He gave a new philosophy of work for the modern world. One of the important principles Swami Vivekananda


learned from his Master, Sri Ramakrishna, was *Shiva Jnane Jiva Seva*—'service to living beings looking upon them as veritable embodiments of the Divine'.

**VIVEKDISHA** is an information and communication technology (ICT) –based network of Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University, Belur, Howrah, West Bengal, India. It is providing a single window –based services like online education from secondary to undergraduate level, online teachers' training, Spiritual Heritage programmes, telemedicine services and research programmes.



#### VIVEKDISHA Network:

At present we have 21 VIVEKDISHA centres in West Bengal for Online and offline education, teachers training and other activities. The University has the provision to connect **twenty five centres** for videoconferencing through **Internet Broadband facility** anywhere at anytime on the globe. The centre at University, Belur Math is the Expert Centre, while the other centres in West Bengal and other areas are participating centres. The distribution of the Vivekdisha Centres in West Bengal is wide enough to cover a greater part of the State of West Bengal—from Raiganj, in the north of the state, to the Sundarban region in the south, and to the district of Bardhaman in the west. All the Vivekdisha Centres are located in the branch centres of Ramakrishna Mission or in places where ex-students/devotees of Ramakrishna Mission run centres with dedication to the Ramakrishna-Vivekananda ideology.



**Tele-education:** Tele-education is the use of information and communication technology to provide online and offline education. In today's world, education is needed for sustainable development. Tele-education encompasses a new vision of education that seeks to empower people of all ages to assume responsibility for creating and enjoying a sustainable future. As the world is gradually becoming more and more connected, ICT-based teaching practices in education are being extensively used and emphasized, although face-to-face meetings or synchronous interaction in real time are still required to supplement asynchronous and independent learning, if more effective learning is to take place. ICT facilitates a high level of interaction among students and the teacher, with the aid of multimedia-based materials. Hence, communication can be dynamic between the teachers and students through video-conferencing.

ICT-based learning offers greater diversity of learning goals, projects, activities, and exercises than traditional classroom learning. Also it allows the learners to make full use of their own multiple cognitive abilities and conative powers. In the ICT-based teaching-learning process, teachers and students alike are enthused because teaching becomes more dynamic, expanding their vision and making available high quality study materials. Moreover, teachers are motivated to teach more creatively and to exchange lesson plans and pedagogical strategies with their colleagues all over the globe even on a day to day basis.



#### What exactly happens in an online class? :

A teacher teaches using a digital notepad or multimedia presentation prepared by using computer software. This is transmitted simultaneously to all the centres logged in to the University Expert Centre. In these centres the students are able to see and hear the teacher, the multimedia presentation, the notepad as well as students at other centres who are also participating in the online class. At the same time, the teacher at the University Expert centre or anywhere on the globe can see and hear all the participating centres. It is a virtual class room whose boundaries are not defined! It makes a vibrant interactive virtual classroom environment for the teacher and students at various geographically isolated centres.

#### **On-going Activities:**

The regular transmission of various programmes through the VIVEKDISHA Centres has generated great enthusiasm besides opening up enormous possibilities for the all-round development of the locality in which these centres are situated. Programmes are transmitted from the **University Expert Centre** at **Belur Math** with unerring regularity.

#### **Online classes a Salient Features:**

(a) Classes are held in Bangla or in English, for the students of Classes six to twelve in an interactive mode for the benefit of participants. In case of higher classes the medium of instruction is English.

b) ICT tools like PC, laptop, LCD monitor, camera, digital notepad, projectors, audio system, many software etc. are used to make the teaching-learning process not only more effective, but more joyful and fruitful as well.

c) Interactions and discussions give the learners certain inputs that take them to a slightly higher level than the classes in which they are presently studying.

d) The technique of tackling questions and the art of writing precise and relevant answers are also highlighted with examples.

e) Students are encouraged to ask questions till they gain a proper understanding of the topic under discussion.

f) Teachers from different institutions are giving free service.

g) The time table is modified/expanded according to the feedback received from different stakeholders especially students.

**Youth Interaction across various regions:** It has become a fashion, and perhaps an obsession, among the youth to communicate with one other and exchange views through the internet and other online devices that are now freely available. These devices doubtless have theirvicious influences, but cannot be totally avoided. In tune with Swami Vivekananda's thoughts, these very devices could be turned into agencies for positive and elevating thinking and education if the youth could be properly guided. The online networking involving the youth that we are trying to building up, which may be called the Youth Thought Exchange Programme Initiative, is a step towards building bridges of national and international level understanding.

#### **Content Generation:**

(a) For School and college education: Content generation is one of the key factors in teaching science, Value Education and communicative English. The contents published in print media cannot be updated in a short span of time, but in the case of ICT-based content, easy and swift revision and updating are made possible through circulation of content both to the learners and to other experts/professionals in the field of science teaching, Value Education and communicative English, who can make suggestions for updating information.

(b) Development of Multimedia-based Study Materials with Special Focus on Higher Values of Life: Multimedia based study materials for different science subjects, communicative English, etc., are being prepared and constantly upgraded keeping in view the value education aspect by incorporating positive ideas based on Swamiji's teachings.

#### **Telemedicine:**

Telemedicine technology makes it possible for doctors at a hospital or an Expert Centre to examine, advise and direct the treatment of patients in remote centres. The technology gives rural residents access to medical specialists who are not often available in remote areas. This saves the patient the cost of travelling to the doctor for advice and treatment and also allows family members to participate in the discussions. The specialist service may involve general diagnosis disease. of dermatology, orthopaedics, pathology,


etc. This technology can also be used to provide follow-up care for patients who have had surgical interventions. This service will also help the non-specialist and local doctors to gain advanced knowledge that would enable them to treat their patients better.

#### Value Education:

Inculcation of higher human values is one important objective of the VIVEKDISHA Project, particularly in the youth. Values imbibed and practised in one's own life makes life valuable and living joyous. To inculcate the attitude of practising higher ideals in life and to influence young minds right from the school days,

VIVEKDISHA has taken up this value education programme, which used presentations multimedia to illustrate Ramakrishna-Vivekananda teachings for students of various age groups, followed by a lively interactive session. Spiritual classes have also been conducted for youth and various adults at centres through videoconferencing from the Expert Centre at University.

Value education books are introduced through creation of Book Banks at different schools and also taken up as rapid readers at different classes to promote values in life. Certain regulations as to food are necessary; we must use that food which brings us the purest mind.

## **Other Activities:**

#### 1) Bringing out Integrated Science Text Books with modern ideas:

We are keenly scrutinizing science books that have been published at the secondary and higher secondary levels, and trying to eliminate and correct certain fundamental errors that have crept into them and unfortunately perpetuated for decades on end. We are trying to put our expertise in the field of Physical and Life Sciences to rectify such fundamental errors by drawing attentions to many professors, teachers, authors and administrative personnel of various universities, colleges, schools and educational bodies. As a result books for classes 6 to 8 are published by West Bengal Board of Secondary Education accepted our most of corrections for these classes.

**Publication of a concept-based Science book for Secondary students:** VIVEKDISHA has published a book on Science of International standard in Bangla to build students' science concepts with an integrated approach to various subjects the students learn at the secondary level. This book is also tool for the teachers at secondary level in the following way:

- To refresh one's science understanding of the topic and to gain awareness of potential misconceptions that the students may bring to the topic
- To use the thoughtful questions in the book to find out what the students already think and why they think that
- To use the concepts to decide what the students need to think about next
- To select lab demonstrations mentioned in the book that will support the intended learning of the young learners

#### 2) Workshops with Teachers at several places:

Educational expectations and curricula are constantly evolving. Advances in technology require new skills and offer new ways of learning, both in school and later in a complex and changeable socio-economic situations. Professional development helps teachers keep up with those changes and pass them on to their students. Professional

development for one teacher benefits the entire school by bringing fresh ideas, insights and enthusiasm to everyone. Good teachers become great teachers by going beyond the call of duty and beyond the textbook. To do this, he or she must continue their education. Our workshops with teachers intended to provide the teachers extra help to equip them better motivated teachers. Our workshops also provide an opportunity to understand how to integrate technology into the classroom and how to make it cross curricular.

**3) Online Teachers' Training:** Our everyday online Teachers' training programme is a real demonstration of teaching methods, screening and selection process of contents and integration of the contents with various other topics and above all innovative methods of building up of the concepts among the students.

**4) Online Life Science Teachers Workshops:** What's the best thing about this online Life science Teachers meet? The teachers, of course! To meet teachers of different schools urban and rural, to share the ideas of concept-based and innovative teaching ideas and also to understand the role that multimediabased VIVEKDISHA online education plays for students. Through this meeting we are assisting teachers in the process of building



capacity to bring a positive change in teaching-learning methods. The goal is to get others involved in learning and creating so that the workload is shared. This process of new initiative in a school need to be integrated with teaching of various subjects and co-curricular activities and not just science teaching.

**5) Creation of Book Banks in different Schools:** Putting quality books in the hands of the children who **need them most.** VIVEKDISHA has pioneered groundbreaking channels to provide quality books and educational resources for free to schools serving children in need. We provide teachers and school administrators with greater access to high-quality books that otherwise would not be available to them. Through Book Banks created by VIVEKDISHA in different schools, educators can create enriched learning experiences for their students, and the children can enjoy an ongoing supply of wonderful quality books for their joyful learning.





**6) International Programmes:** To address widening health and social inequalities, VIVEKDISHA at Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University (RKMVU), Belur Math, and the Global Health Share<sup>®</sup> (GHS) initiative at the University of California, Davis (UCD) have begun a novel partnership to improve public health education and outreach efforts and to promote research that will contribute to nutritional health and increased food security in rural, low-income regions adversely impacted by climate change and seasonal disasters.

**Objectives:** Scheme titled 'Swami Vivekananda District Yoga Wellness Centre (SVDYWC)' under Public Private Partnership (PPP) model has been devised in the year 2011 by Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga (MDNIY), an autonomous organization under the Department of AYUSH, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India, for the purpose of planning, training, promotion and coordination of Yoga Education, Research and Therapy in all its aspects in supporting Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) partially to promote Yogic activates for public/community healthcare and to encourage utilization of Yoga professional in public health care delivery programme.

#### Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University, a Nodal Office of SVDYWC scheme:

Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University, Belur Math, Howrah was selected and approved by Morarji Desai National Institute of Yoga (MDNIY), New Delhi as a Unit of SVDYWC, called Nodal Office, so as to provide monitoring for establishing infrastructural facilities , help in selecting suitable technical staff and to assist the center in implementing the Yoga Scheme programme in an effective manner to each SVDYWC scattered in 12 states and 23 districts.. The Nodal Yoga Institute shall also periodically evaluate the progress of each SVDYWC through periodic physical inspections and send

the half yearly, annual progress report of each SVDYWC to MDNIY with specific recommendation for continuation in the next year.

**Starting Phase – II of SVDYWC Scheme in the year 2013:** SVDYWC Phase- I started from 01 August 2011. During the second year of Phase -1, i.e. in the year 2013, MDNIY accorded approval (w.e.f. 01 April 2013) of more 12 new SVDYW centres under Phase-II Scheme within the purview of Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University, Nodal Yoga Office with a view to bring more SVDYWC in each district of Assam, Manipur, Nagaland and West Bengal to implement the essence of remedial measures of diseases through different programmes of yoga among the local people of respective district where SVDYWC has been approved.

## **Report of SVDYWC for the Period of 01.04.2015 to 31.03.2016:**

**Phase – II:** Total eight SVDYW centres conducted different programmes of the Yoga Scheme in the third year of Phase-II, that is during the period 2015-16. Yoga centres are scattered in West Bengal and North-east states of India i.e. Assam, Meghalaya & Manipur. During the period total number programmes conducted were 319 (except RYTP, the daily morning & evening programmes) and number of beneficiaries were 33,501.

#### Eight SVDYWCs are-

- (5) Sri Aurobindo Institute of Indian Cultur, Meghalaya, District- East Khasi Hills, Shillong,
- (6) Prabudha Bharati Shisutirtha, West Bengal, Districts- Paschim Medinipur,
- (7) Chuanpur-Saptaparni, West Bengal, District- Murshidabad,
- (8) Sri Aurobindo Bhavan Trust, West Bengal, District- Nadia

**Two centres of Assam in the districts Udalguri and Nagaon**: The performances of these SVDYWCs situated in the districts mentioned are found to be satisfactory. During the year Udalguri district yoga centre conducted 15 Foundation courses in Yoga (FCY), 21 Yoga Awareness Programmes (YAP) and 13 Yoga Programmes for Wellbeings and Seminars in their respective centres and also in remote places of districts (Bhergaon, Tanglagaon etc.) which are mostly inhabited by tribal and backward people. They have conducted the above programmes in different school and college students who received the benefits of yoga in their daily life. Total people benifitted were 8693.

In the district of Nagaon of Assam the inhabitants are mostly muslim farmers who have accepted gladly the benefits of yoga by performing the same in their daily life. The male and female Muslim students of Madrasas are taking active part in the different yoga programmes conducted by the trainers of this SVDYWC. During the year they have conducted 11 Foundation courses in Yoga (FCY), 14 Yoga Awareness Programmes (YAP) and 9 Yoga Programmes for Wellbeings. Total people benifitted were 1609. Altogether in both the districts 10,302 people including students have been benefited during the year.

**Two centers of Manipur in the Districts Imphal East and Bishnupur**: Two SVDYW centres were recognized by MDNIY under Phase-II in Manipur situated in the district of Imphal East and Bishnupur. Manipur is also a backward and underdeveloped state in the eastern part of India. In villages like Khonganangkhong, Bamoh Leikai, Khurai Nandeibem, Leiki club of Achanfigei, Singjamei different yoga programmes were conducted. It was started in a very slow process as the people are not all in a position to accept yoga comfortably. Total 1932 students and people received the benefits of yoga in this year from total 30 programmes of FCYW, YAP & SPGW conducted in both districts (except RYTP). Despite the poor connectivity, bottlenecks in travelling or transportation from one village to another village in the hilly terrain area, yoga staffs are still working with sincere dedication for popularising the Yoga in Manipur.

**One centre of Meghalaya in the district East Khasi Hills, Shillong**: Only one SVDYWC centre is working in Shillong, District East Khasi Hills. Sri Aurobindo Institute of Indian Culture is working remarkably among all classes of people residing there. It is very hopeful to note that more than 4704 students from schools & colleges and common people were benefited in this year from of 129 programmes of FCYW, YAP & SPGW.

Three centers of West Bengal in the Districts Paschim Medinipur, Murshidabad and Nadia: Since the people of West Bengal state are well conversed with and conscious about the benefit of yoga in life, the response from the people are quite satisfactory in comparison to the north-easterns part of India. The employees working in government offices, police lines and students from schools, colleges, clubs and sanghas are very much interested and eagerly taking part in the different yoga programmes conducted by SVDYW centres. Altogether 16,563 people were benefited from 77 programmes of FCY, YAP, Yoga Programmes for Wellbeings in this year.
