Brief Profile and Report of Activities for the Financial Year 2017-18 (01 April 2017 to 31 March 2018)

1. Historic Backdrop: Swami Vivekananda's Vision and Objectives:



Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University, formerly known as 'Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute' is a humble first step in actualizing Swami Vivekananda's vision of a University at Belur Math, the headquarters of Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission that he founded at the behest of his Master, Sri Ramakrishna Paramahamsa. In fact, on 2 July 1902, just a couple of days before he passed away, Swami Vivekananda prophesied that "the spiritual impact that has come to Belur [Math] will last fifteen hundred years; and it will be a great university. Do not think I imagine it; I see it." On another occasion, he wrote: "Now, the aim is to gradually develop this [Belur] Math into an all

round university." As a humble step in actualizing this vision, Ramakrishna Mission started a University in 2005 under the name 'Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute'. It is also known as 'Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University', as subsequently renamed. In its effort to actualize Swami Vivekananda's vision of imparting 'man-making' and character-building education, the University has set its objectives as achieving excellence in the field of higher education on the one hand and on the other to create a band of educated youth who would, in Swami Vivekananda's words, possess 'muscles of iron and nerves of steel and a mind made of the same material of which the thunderbolt is made'—in short the objective is the creation of 'complete human beings' with 'head, hand and heart' fully developed: 'heart to feel, brains to conceive, and hands to work', men and women of impeccable character, inflexible moral fibre, penetrating intellects, lion-like courage and above all, intense feeling for the underprivileged and the downtrodden masses of India, those who would passionately feel and work for rebuilding a glorious India of the future—powerful, vigorous and rejuvenated.

2. Objectives, Uniqueness and Salient Features—the 'thrust areas':

The uniqueness of the University consists in its following salient features: (i) the emphasis on certain 'thrust areas' which are also 'gap areas' in that these areas scarcely receive any attention in the conventional universities in India, (ii) the multi-campus character of the University—it operates through a wide network of specialized Faculty Centres in these thrust areas located in different parts of India at the various branch-centres of Ramakrishna Mission some of which have been working in these areas for decades, (iii) the inculcation of higher human values in our attempt to realize Swami Vivekananda's vision of education as 'life-building, man-making character-making assimilation of ideas'—value-based education forms the essential component of *all* the courses run by the University.

To start with, the following 'thrust areas' have been chosen:

- (1) Disability Management and Special Education
- (2) Integrated Rural Development including Tribal Development
- (3) Indian Cultural and Spiritual Heritage and Value Education
- **(4)** Fundamental sciences—integrated teaching and research
- (5) Environmental Science and Disaster Management including relief and rehabilitation

2(A) Special Features of Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education (FDMSE) Coimbatore Campus, Tamil Nadu:

The Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education (FDMSE) is located in the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, a major education center of the Ramakrishna Mission.

FDMSE is playing an active role in the field of disability management for last three decades. It offers comprehensive services to persons with various disabilities. It caters to the educational and vocational training needs pertaining to persons with disabilities. The Faculty offers training not only to the personnel seeking knowledge in training of persons with disabilities but also to the persons with disabilities who seek training in areas such as Computers, Braille, Abacus, Orientation & Mobility, Sign Language.

IHRDC - Vidyalaya Unit for the Persons with Disabilities and its up gradation to DMSE

The International Human Resource Development Centre for the Disabled (IHRDC) was established in 1984 with the primary objective of producing Braille books for blind children and later on upgraded to an independent international institute of full-fledged human resource development in disability management in the year 2001. The Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, as per its notification dated 5 January 2005, based on the recommendation of the University Grants Commission (UGC), accorded a University – status to our International Human Resource Development Center for the Disabled (IHRDC) in the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, naming it as the Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute (RKMVERI). Later the name of the institute was coined as Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University (RKMVU), having its Headquarters at Ramakrishna Mission, Belur Math, West Bengal with its Department of Disability Management and Special Education (DMSE) in the Vidyalaya, Coimbatore after receiving official communication from University Grants Commission.

Vision of FDMSE:

The aim of FDMSE is to translate the vision of Swami Vivekananda into action. The vision of FDMSE is based on the fact that the strength of persons, of even those with disabilities, can be aroused for constructive purposes by professionally trained teachers. The Faculty believes that by strengthening the hearing ability of visually impaired person, visual ability of hearing impaired person, motor ability of mentally retarded persons and cognitive ability of persons with locomotor disability through well trained professionals, seemingly impossible results may be achieved. The human resource development of a country is directly linked to the level of education of its citizens. Special efforts are to be taken to bring the disabled populations under the umbrella of education to tap their potential and make them contributing members to the society. Without providing education for the disabled children we cannot claim to have provided education to all. In

order to train teachers to take up this important work of educating children with special needs, DMSE is offering courses in Special Education.

Mission of FDMSE:

- Offering training programme at all levels for preparing personnel and professionals for special education and rehabilitation programmes, catering to the needs of persons with visual impairment, hearing impairment and mental retardation.
- Organizing short term training programs for preparing multi-purpose rehabilitation workers to serve persons with disabilities.
- Organizing awareness programmes for parents, administrators and public for facilitating effective implementation of service programmes for persons with disabilities.
- Promoting context based models leading to educating all children with disabilities.
- Preparing literature such as handouts and brochures on education and rehabilitation of persons with disabilities.
- Organizing orientation programmes for general classroom teachers for implementing inclusive education programme for the disabled children.
- Promoting research in specific educational and rehabilitation areas, whose results would strengthen development of inclusive schooling and community based rehabilitation programmes.
- Offering continuing education programmes for the personnel working in the field of education and rehabilitation of the disabled.
- Providing guidance & counselling services for persons with special needs to promote education & employment opportunities.

A meeting of faculty members of the Department of Sanskrit Studies was convened ad hoc on 29th November 2017, to discuss the logistics and structure of the Seminar to be held in January 2018 to commemorate the 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Abhedanandaji Maharaj. All the faculty members were in attendance.

New Permanent Faculty:

Shri Dr. Vishwanath Dhital joined as an assistant professor in the Department of Sanskrit Studies on 1^{st} January 2018. He used to be a visiting faculty in the Department earlier on a number of times.

Launching of Communicative Sanskrit Courses:

As per the discussions in the Meeting of M.Phil And Ph.D. Scholars and Faculty on 13th December 2017, Communicative Sanskrit Courses were lauched in three levels – Preliminary, Intermediate and Advanced – **on 4th Februay 2018**. The Coordinator for the courses was Dr. Vishwanath Dhital, assisted by three Joint-Coordinators who were Saibal Acharya, Joydeb Dinda and Amit Kumar Dey, respectively.

Ashtavadhanam at Belur Math:

Date: Friday, 23rd February 2018, from 1 pm to 4 pm.

Venue: Main pandal near Shri Ramakrishna's Temple, Belur Math.

Ashtavadhanam is an ancient Indian art form that demonstrates wonderfully the enormous powers of the human mind. It is not a mere scholarly performance, but a tremendous *sadhana* born of one pointed application of mind.

Ashtavadhani Vidwan Dr Venkataramana Bhat, Asst. Prof., Dept of Sanskrit Studies, RKMVERI, Belur Math, is an expert in this unique art form. He began performing at the age of 19 and over the years has performed Ashtavadhanam for nearly 160 times in Sanskrit and over 150 times in old and modern Kannada at different places in Karnataka and Andhra Pradesh. Ashtavadhanam consists of eight questioners called *prichhakas* surrounding the main Ashtavadhani who sits in the middle. Four of the *prichhakas* sit on the left and four on the right of the Ashtavadhani. Each questioner has a specific role and has a traditional name for fulfilling this role. The programme was well attended and appreciated by all.

Send-off for Dr. Vishwanath Dhital:

Dr. Vishwanath Dhital, who had joined the Department as a permanent faculty on 1st January 2018, submitted his resignation from the post of assistant professor in the Department on 14th March 2018, in order to join IIT BHU as a faculty member. He was granted the release order on 24th March 2018. On the same day he was accorded a hearty send-off by all the students, faculty members and monks. Dr Dhital left for Varanasi in the evening of the same day.

Department infrastructure development

A state of the start Cisco speaker tracking video conferencing equipment was installed in the Prajna Bhavan Seminar room. Purchase and installation of the equipment costed 36 lakhs INR. The entire project was funded by Tata Consultancy Services (TCS).

Students' Summer Project (May-June 2017)

The CS and BDA students were encouraged to carry out a 1½ month summer project on a topic of their choice. The students were diligently guided by the inhouse faculty. At the completion of the project each student was given 30 minutes for presention, demonstration, and cross-questioning. The MSc BDA students were able to showcase the outcome of these projects during their internship interview held by TCS in November 2017, which by the way served as a proof of these students' abilities to carry out technical projects. It is note worthy that **Dr. Sudipta Das** guided a group of 6 MSc BDA students.

Each student will be required to submit a detailed project report as a partial fullfilment towards qualifying for MSc degree.

Annexure

State of the art projects in machine learning supervised by **Tanmay Basu**

A. Sentiment analysis over social media

The objective of this work is to automatically understand and summarize the conversations of a particular community over social media using NLP and machine learning techniques, so as to easily comprehend the discussion among the peers. Only a few researchers around the world are working in this topic, however we are focusing only on the social media conversations regarding health-care.

The machine learning group at RKMVERI is working in collaboration with some researchers in Department of Learning Health Sciences, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, USA to build this tool. We posted different questions as short message text to different adolescent pregnant women in Ann Arbor area and collected their replies. Further NLP and machine learning techniques are applied to summarize the reactions. The automatic annotations are then compared with the manual annotations.

We are also working with some clinicians from School of Public Health, University of Michigan, who are responsible for data creation and manual annotation of the conversations. Therefore we would reach a consensual decision after some rounds of such manual annotation. In principle, the automatic tool will guide the manual process. The model is evaluated on a completely different set of data using the manual annotations. We have published the results in a conference on a number of questions and also submitted a paper to Journal of Medical Internet Research to explain the proposed method and results.

B. Early detection of anorexia

The machine learning team at RKMVERI has participated in ERISK-2018 challenge-1. ERISK stands for early detection of risks. The task here is to detect anorexia and depression by analyzing the blog posts over Reddit 2, a social media. Anorexia is a kind of eating disorders and many times people suffer a lotdue to their ignorance about the symptoms of the disease. Patients with anorexia demonstrate a refusal to maintain minimally normal body weight (e.g., the actual weight is less than 85% of the expected weight), an intense fear of weight gain, and a disturbance in the perception of body shape and weight. The objective here is to automatically identify these types of symptoms from the data using machine learning techniques for early detection of anorexia. The given corpus contains the blog posts over Reddit. A part of the corpus is manually labeled by the domain experts, known as training set. The training set is divided into two categories anorexia and non anorexia. The aim is to train a machine learning classifier using the

training set to identify anorexia of the blog posts of other part of the corpus, for which the ground truths are not provided. Therefore the performance of the classifier will be evaluated by the organizers using the ground truths after the deadline. We have developed several machine learning frameworks by using different feature engineering schemes to identify discriminative characteristics of anorexia to improve the performance of the classifier. The work of finding the best framework is underway.

C. Qualitative analysis on text classification and text clustering techniques

Text classification is the problem of assigning predefined categories to the new text documents by using the information from the existing documents in thosepredefined categories. A growing number of statistical learning methods have been applied to this problem in recent years. K-nearest neighbor (kNN) decision rule is one of the most fundamental, simple and effective method for data classification. It is very useful for text classification and it has comparable performance to various other text classification methods. However, the method has some limitations, e.g., predicting a valid k is difficult for text data. We are working towards finding a novel method to overcome these limitations of kNN decision rule for text classification. We have developed some ideas in this direction and got some results. However, the work is still in progress. We are working on another problem on text clustering. Text clustering methods partition a set of documents into different clusters such that the documents in the same cluster are more similar to each other than documents in different clusters according to some similarity or dissimilarity measure. The existing text clustering algorithms determine the content similarity of a pair of documents for putting them into the same cluster. Thus the performance of a text clustering algorithm is mainly dependent on the similarity measure. There are some limitations of these content similarity measures. In this work, we have introduced a content similarity measure to improve the effectiveness of the spectral clustering technique, a type of text clustering methods. The proposed framework is tested on some standard corpora. The results are reasonable. However, we still have to improve in terms of tuning some parameters of the proposed similarity measure.

Scientific report on the event

The event, modeled as a unique and an intense workshop, featured several expository lectures on frontier areas of research by experts of repute chosen from leading research institutes and universities across India as well as from the host organization, the Department of Physics, RKMVERI. There were both experienced and young researchers delivering lectures in the workshop. On a typical day of the workshop, there were four 1hour long talks, two in the morning and two in the afternoon, and a 1.5-hour long interactive evening talk as part of a special 5-lecture course. The workshop was aimed at Ph. D., M. Sc. and third-year B. Sc. students. Lectures were delivered on a wide range of topics chosen from as diverse areas as condensed matter physics, gravitation, non-linear dynamics, statistical physics, and quantum computation. Professor N. Mukunda from IISc., Bangalore gave a set of 5 lectures on a topic that is quite foundational, yet rarely discussed in text books on classical mechanics, namely, the topic of Dirac theory of constrained dynamical systems. Professor Mustansir Barma from TIFR, Hyderabad emphasized the importance of fluctuations in bringing about the remarkable universality observed near the critical points of many systems (fluids, magnets ...). An interesting highlight of his lectures was the revelation that although ordering is in general destroyed by fluctuations larger than the average, there are notable exceptions in which a system exhibits the phenomenon of fluctuation-dominated phase ordering, whereby fluctuations and order coexist. Professor Vijay Shenoy from IISc., Bangalore introduced in his lectures the field of topological insulators, a topic of huge recent interest. The key results conveyed in his two lectures were: (i) there are more than one type of band insulators in one dimension, which can be distinguished by the topology of their ground-state wave-functions, and (ii) a summary of the "periodic table of topological phases," and an exploration of the ten-fold symmetry classification of Fermionic systems.

Professor Arvind from IISER, Mohali lectured on quantum information and quantum computation. He introduced the notion of quantum entanglement and its quantitative measures based on entropy and partial transpose. Further, he introduced the idea behind quantum cryptography protocols. The lectures of Professor Krishnendu Sengupta from IACS, Kolkata were devoted to the area of non-equilibrium dynamics around quantum critical points. In his lectures, he covered the basic aspects of non-equilibrium dynamics of closed quantum systems, and demonstrated that they may have relevance in the physics of ultracold atoms. Professor Ram Ramaswamy from JNU, New Delhi decided to talk about the very interesting topic of collective synchronization in dynamical systems. He described the phenomenon in coupled linear and nonlinear dynamical systems, including those wherein the dynamics is chaotic, when the coupling is linear and nonlinear, and when there is time delay in the coupling. In the wake of recent upsurge in interest in gravitational waves, Professor Pankaj Joshi from TIFR,

Mumbai talked about Black Holes, discussing the current status of research on gravitational collapse of massive stars in the Universe in the framework of Einstein's theory of general relativity, the formation of black holes and naked singularities and their observational, astrophysical and quantum gravity implications. Dr. Shamik Gupta from the Department of Physics, RKMVERI, discussed how one may study theoretically the problem of spontaneous synchronization using tools from dynamical system theory and statistical physics. The talk was planned as a tale of a fascinating journey along a winding path that wanders through mathematical biology, kinetic theory, bifurcation theory, and plasma physics. All the lectures of the workshop have been videotaped and would soon be uploaded to a dedicated YouTube channel. We had arranged for online submission of applications. There was an overwhelming response to our announcement of the workshop, and within the span of less than a month, we received as many as 150 applications from all across India. For logistic reasons, we had to limit the number of participants, which we achieved by making a careful selection based on the academic performance of the applicants. In the end, there were participants from all the leading academic institutions, including the IIT's, the IISER's, NISER, IISc., IACS, SNBNCBS, St. Xaviers', Calcutta University, JNU, Jadavpur University, Presidency University, RKM Vivekananda College Chennai, IIEST, NIT, University of Hyderabad, etc. In addition, there were Ph. D. as well as first and second year M. Sc. students from the Department of Physics, RKMVERI who participated in the workshop. The total number of students, both local and outstation, who attended the workshop was 55. A particularly appreciated aspect of the workshop has been the opportunity that the participants and the lecturers had to engage in animated discussions. The workshop was rather timely, allowing for a fast dissemination of recent progress in theoretical physics across various disciplines to young researchers, thereby contributing significantly towards the outreach efforts of the hosting organization. All the lecturers sent back very encouraging feedback on the workshop, emphasizing in particular the fact that they were very glad to observe that the participants did not hesitate to ask questions and clarify their doubts. The participants also expressed a final positive opinion that was well beyond a formal congratulation.

Admission to the M.Sc. courses

The Entrance Test for admission to the M.Sc. ARD and M.Sc. AgBT courses was held at the IRDM Faculty Centre of RKMVU on **10 June 2017**. This year, 122 and 118 applications were received for the M. Sc. ARD and M.Sc. AgBT courses respectively. Among these, 88 and 85 applicants were shortlisted for personal interview. Finally, 25 students for both the courses were selected. The admission took place up to **24 June 2017**.

- 2. Rishikalpa Bhattacharya, an undergraduate student of Rural Development from Tata Institute of Social Sciences did his internship at the IRDM Faculty Centre during **May 2017**.
- 3. Dr. Naba Kumar Duary, Research Associate (Cultural) at the Anthropological Survey of India delivered a lecture on "Traditional Knowledge of Common People" on **13 June 2017** at the IRDM Faculty Centre. The lecture was followed by the screening of a documentary on 'Bene Putul workers'.
- 4. Research/Laboratory activities:

All India Network Program on Organic Farming (AINPOF)

The School of Agriculture and Rural Development, Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute, initiated Network Project on Organic Farming (NPOF) in 2015. This project has been fully supported and funded by ICAR-IIFSR, Modipuram till now.

Objectives:

To study the impact of organic, inorganic and integrated crop management practices on crop productivity and soil health.

To study the impact of various management practices on the microbial population of soil and economics.

To study the biochemical properties of different plant-beneficial microbes present in composted materials.

To identify the plant-beneficial microbes present in the final compost manure produced using different farm waste and /or using different composting method.

To explore the scientific basis of the age old organic Indigenous Traditional Knowledges (ITKs) used by the Indian farmers for crop production and protection.

Progress report and successful execution:

- **1.** The four cropping systems with six different managements were implemented successfully starting from Kharif season of 2015. The growth and yield parameters of different crops were documented for all cropping systems. Soil physico-chemical and biological properties were also determined and documented.
- **2.** Till date, two different ITKs i.e, *Panchagavya* and *Shasyagavya* were scientifically characterized and validated. Plant-beneficial bacterial isolates from these two ITKs were characterized by various modern biochemical and molecular tools.
- **3.** We have shown, for the first time, that *Shasyagavya* is a rich nutrient source and is also found to be enriched with various plant-beneficial bacteria such as nitrogen fixers, phsophate solubilizers, IAA producers etc.
- **4.** During last two years, we conducted surveys to characterize organic farmers (65 in total) in the district of South 24-parganas. This will help to map the clusters of organic farmers in West Bengal in future.

Initially, two Senior Research Fellows (SRFs) were supported as manpower. But, due to cut off in budget by the ICAR, the project supports one SRF and one Young Professional-I.

Future prospects:

This project started in the year of 2015 and is successfully running for consecutive three years at Narendrapur. This project has a great potential to sanction as All India Coordinated Project (AICRP) on Organic Farming in near future. ICAR team visited our university on 12th March, 2018 and was highly impressed with our instrumental facility to carry out basic research in organic farming. They also discussed about the possibility of sanctioning AICRP project under this university. It should be noted that the university can enjoy 2 to 3 scientists, 2 SRFs, one non-teaching staff, and other posts from AICRP-funded Project.

We have already submitted a Tribal Sub-Plan project of about Rs. 33.05 lakhs under NPOF. ICAR team suggested to submit this project during their visit to Narendrapur.

ICAR is also encouraging us to identify and validate various kinds of biomolecules, which are responsible for taste and scent, from different crops grown under organic cultivation. We are currently writing this concept note and the project proposal will be submitted soon to the ICAR.

Biotechnology and Microbiology laboratory:

- Dr. Amitava Chatterjee completed two projects namely "Anti tumor efficacy of Black Tea Polyphenols [Funded by National Tea Research Foundation]" and "In search of potential tumor marker [Funded by DST, Govt. of West Bengal]" from the laboratory
- Dr. Chatterjee has submitted two projects "Activated MMP-2 as breast cancer Marker" [submitted to DBT, Govt. of WB] and "Identification of MNP-inhibitory factor(s) from aqueous extract of *Aza indica*" to AYUSH/ DST, WB-DBT, WB
- The laboratory is recently being funded by DST-SERB under the supervision of Dr. Gautam Chatterjee; procurements of instrument and laboratory set-up completed under this project.
- Students of 4th Semester (M.Sc in AgBt) have started their dissertation work in biotechnology laboratory of IRDM Faculty Centre from January 12, 2018.

Plant Tissue culture laboratory:

- Under the NHM Project, this laboratory is finally ready to sale the product G9 variety banana. This activity has gained attention by the outsiders during Tricelebrations of Ashrama during 26-29th January, 2018.
- Standardization of Date palm is going on under the guidance of Dr. Joshita Vijayan.

Report for the period from 1 April 2017 to 31 March 2018

Introduction:

Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVK) is a frontline extension institute established by the Indian Council of Agriculture Research (ICAR), Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India for a district, for transfer of technology in the field of agriculture, horticulture, animal husbandry, aquaculture etc. 'Sasya Shyamala' Krishi Vigyan Kendra has been newly established for the district of South 24 Parganas under the aegis of *Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute* as the 2nd KVK in the district. This is as per the policy decision of the Government of India to establish additional KVKs in the larger districts of the country.

Sasya Shyamala Krishi Vigyan Kendra is a new KVK establishedin 2013 with young, energetic, enthusiastic and dedicated fellow Subject Matter Specialists in different disciplines. The KVK is now actively engaged in dissemination of technologies to the farmers, farm women and rural youths and development of farm sector in South 24 Parganas district. This is the first of its kind in the Zone-II in order to facilitate providing better technology service to the farming community of the district, located at Arapanch, P.O.-Sonarpur, Dist.-South 24 Parganas, Kolkata-700150, four km. away from Sonarpur Railway Station by the side of the Sonarpur – Ghatakpukur Road.

It came into existence through promulgation of ICAR notification (vide: F.No.6-1/2010 AE-1. dtd: 28th February, 2013). However, activities of this new KVK were started from November, 2013. It has been vested upon important responsibilities of developing socio- economic condition of farming community of South 24 Parganas district through its mandated activities on organization of on-farm trials based on farmers' problems, vocational training in agriculture and allied enterprises, frontline demonstration on major cereals, oilseeds, pulses and other enterprises related to agriculture, horticulture, fisheries, animal husbandry, quality seed and planting material production for the farmers.

Mandate of the KVK:

Assessment, Refinement and Demonstration of Technologies and Technology products.

Activities of the KVK:

Based on the mandates following activities have been defined for the KVK -

- **(a) On-Farm Testing (OFT)** to assess the location specificity of agricultural technologies under various farming systems.
- **(b) Frontline Demonstration (FLD)** forout scaling farm innovations and to showcase the specific benefits/worth of technologies on farmers' fields.
- **(c) Training** for capacity development of farmers, farm women, rural youths and extension personnel to update their knowledge and skills in modern agricultural technologies and enterprises.
- **(d) Knowledge and Resource Centre** for improving overall agricultural economy in the operational area.

- **(e)** Conduct **frontline extension programmes** and provide farm advisories using Information Communication Technology (ICT) and other media on varied subjects of interest to farmers.
- (f) Documentation, characterization and strategic planning of farming practices.
- **(g) Production of quality seed and planting materials** of different field and horticultural crops, fish seed, kids, chicks, ducklings etc.
- (h) Provide soil health cards to the farmers

An ICT-based Network of Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda Educational and Research Institute

Report for the period from 1 April 2017 to 31 March 2018

RKMVERI is conducting classes using its ICT based network in 20 Schools under West Bengal Board of Secondary Education, 14 schools under West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education, and 1 school under CBSE.

The regular programmes for the 21 remote centres are monitored from the **expert** centre at Belur Math.

Ongoing Activities:

(1) Online classes:

Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, Value Education, and Communicative English for students of Classes six to twelve level are taught mostly through multimedia presentations i.e., through texts, pictures, animations, real visual clips, video recordings from laboratory or operation theatres to make teaching-learning process more effective, joyful and fruitful. We believe that all learners can grow well in digital classrooms that are engaging, learning-focussed and inclusive. The medium of instruction is either Bangla or English. Chemistry and Economics classes for Under-graduate students conducted from USA and UK as per the requirements of the students. Currently the number of student-beneficiaries who are receiving the benefit of VIVEKDISHA online classes has exceeded **13000**, and among them 4937 are rural boys, 1375 are rural girls, 5773 are urban boys and 1544 are urban girls.

(2) Vivekdisha Website:

This site has some special features like:

- 1. Bilingual- The site is in English and in Bangla.
- 2. Online Examinations- The site provides opportunities for students to take practice tests as well as unit tests in different subjects at various levels. The questions can be set in English and in any Indian languages. Students of schools, colleges and universities can take advantage of this unique feature.
- 3. Teaching videos- Some edited videos of our online classes are available here.
- 4. Cross references of different books related to Sri Ramakrishna and Swamiji have been added.
- 5. 360° Studio Provides a panoramic view of a place.

(3) Content Generation for School and college education:

The contents of the multimedia presentations of different Science subjects were developed in local language Bangla or in English in order to fulfil local or national level need. The content of the lessons was developed based on the syllabi of West Bengal Boards or universities or All-India level Entrance exams. The main focus point of the

content generation is concept building and integrating different subjects or topics as per the context of the lessons.

(4) Youth Interaction across various regions:

Students in these online classes belonging to different regions of West Bengal or different States of our country get the feeling of brotherhood and unity through interactions with a large community of eager students all studying together under one particular teacher and sharing the same study material. The common focus of these classes being science or humanities education blended with value education.

(5) Spiritual Heritage Programme for International Audiences:

Vivekdisha is trying to cater the need of the devotees residing in faraway places by log in to the online classes from their homes. At present devotees of Sri Ramakrishna are joining the bilingual class on "Sri Sri Ramakrishna Kathamrita" (The Gospel of Sri Ramakrishna) and "Srimad Bhagavad-Gita" from different countries like United Arab Emeritus (Dubai, Abu Dhabi and Sharjah), United States of America (Cleveland, San Diego, Washington and Fargo), Canada and Germany.

(6) Integrated Science Text Books with current research findings:

We are keenly scrutinizing science books that have been published at the secondary and higher secondary levels, and trying to eliminate and correct certain fundamental errors that have crept into them and unfortunately perpetuated for decades on end. VIVEKDISHA has published **three books** on Science in Bangla of International standard to build students' science concepts with an integrated approach to various subjects the students learn at the secondary level.

(7) Value Education:

Values imbibed in one's own life make his/her life valuable. To inculcate the attitude of practising higher ideals in life and to touch the young minds as early as possible, we have started this value education programme. Multimedia presentations were shown on Ramakrishna-Vivekananda teachings for students of various age groups, along with a lively interactive session.

(8) Creation of Book Banks in different Schools:

VIVEKDISHA has pioneered groundbreaking channels to provide quality books and educational resources for free to schools serving children in need.

(9) Online Workshops and Teachers Workshops at Schools:

Through conducting workshops VIVEKDISHA is assisting teachers in the process of building capacity to bring a positive change in teaching-learning methods and to focus more on concept building rather than rote memory.

(10) Creation of Computer Lab, Online Exam Centres:

In Nawabganj, one of our online schools, we have set up a Computer Lab cum Online Exam Centre. In Apeejay School, Park Street, Kolkata, online exam centre has started functioning.

(11) Publication of a Book on Sri Ramakrishna:

This year a book on Sri Ramakrishna's life and teachings with many relevant pictures was published for beginners. The book has covered most of the important events in his life with little analytical interpretations to bring the attention of readers about the relevance of those incidents in the spiritual life of an aspirant. The book also contains the ideas developed from modern research on his life and teachings.

(12) Distress Relief Works:

We have received different types of garment from a reputed company for distribution mainly for students. So far we have distributed shirts, trousers, sweaters, sweaters, and jackets to 548 male beneficiaries and tops, trousers, sweaters, jackets and dresses to 679 female beneficiaries belonging to Borai, Balarampur, Begampur and Masat areas of West Bengal.

(13) Vivekdisha Studio:

Recordings are done on special occasions in the Vivekdisha Studio. In recent times Doordarshan Kendra Kolkata recorded the narration of Durga Puja performed at Belur Math. Some spiritual talks of senior swamis of the order have also been recorded in this studio.

(14) Research in the field of Education and Communications:

We are constantly gathering knowledge from our online classes and doing research about the methodology of teachings, pattern of examinations, pedagogy, and use of technology for better communications. Our two journal papers regarding telecommunications in remote areas have already been published in IEEE. The recorded videos of our online classes are being uploaded in Vivekdisha website from time to time for the benefit of the students.
